FOUR MEN ARRESTED FOR EVADING MORE THAN \$400,000 IN DUTIES AND TAXES

Singapore, 16 July 2024 – On 11 July 2024, Singapore Customs conducted an operation at Gul Circle leading to the arrest of three Singaporean men, aged 33, 47 and 49, and a Malaysian man, aged 34, for duty and tax evasion.

2 During the operation, Customs officers observed two vans parked behind a lorry along Gul Circle, with four men transferring boxes from the lorry to the van behind it. Officers conducted checks and uncovered 480 cartons of duty-unpaid cigarettes in the van, and another 3,488 cartons in the lorry and on the kerbside.

3 In total, 3,968 cartons of duty-unpaid cigarettes were seized, along with the lorry and two vans. The total duty and Goods and Services Tax (GST) evaded amounted to about \$430,019. Investigations are ongoing.

Buying, selling, conveying, delivering, storing, keeping, possessing or dealing with duty-unpaid goods are serious offences under the Customs Act and the GST Act. Offenders can be fined up to 40 times the amount of duty and GST evaded and/or jailed for up to six years. Vehicles used in committing such offences are also subject to forfeiture.
