> ICP Requirements under Revised Regime

>No ICP required for Individual Permits

➤7 ICP elements required for all Bulk Permits

≻ICP elements:

- End User Screening /Order Screening
- Product Classification
- Internal Audit
- Record Keeping
- Company Commitment
- Appointment of a Strategic Goods Control Officer
- Training



> TradeNet Permit Declaration Requirements

➤As of now, the following fields are mandatory for permits covering the exports for Strategic goods:

- Customs Procedure Code (CPC)
- Procedure Code 1 (PC1)
- Procedure Code 2 (PC2)
- Companies awarded the Tier 3 Permit are required to submit a monthly report by the 14th of every month



> TradeNet Permit Declaration Requirements

> Bulk permit holders will be required to declare :

- Customs Procedure Code (CPC)
- Procedure Code 1 (PC1)
- Procedure Code 2 (PC2)
- Consignee Name
- End User Name (if known)
- Tier 3 Permit holders will no longer be required to submit monthly reports



> Ensuring the Competency of the SGCO

The Strategic Goods Control Officer (SGCO) is important to ensuring compliance within a company

≻It is therefore essential that an SGCO is :

- Aware of the company's obligations under the SGCA
- Aware of the processes and procedures in place within the company to ensure compliance to the SGCA



> Ensuring the Competency of the SGCO

Should the SGCO fail to meet the minimum standards, the company faces the possibility of having their bulk permits suspended.



> Internal Audits

> Internal Audits are essential to ensure that the company's ICP is being effectively implemented

➢Often, companies do not perform a through internal audit of their ICP, and tend to focus purely on auditing documents relating to STS exports

➤To ensure that there is greater clarity on the requirements for internal audit, SC may issue guidelines on conducting an internal audit of a company's ICP.
