 UNSCR 1540 – OP3(d) requires all States to:

"take and enforce effective measures to establish domestic controls to prevent the proliferation of nuclear, chemical, or biological weapons and their means of delivery, including by establishing appropriate controls over related materials and to this end shall: establish, develop, review and maintain appropriate effective national export and trans-shipment controls over such items, including appropriate laws and regulations to control export, transit, trans-shipment and re-export....."

As the UN Member State Malaysia is bound by Article 25 and 48 of the UN Charter to comply with and implement these obligations.

Auto-adoption of Restricted List

- Strategic Trade (Restricted End-Users and Prohibited End-Users) (Amendment) Order 2016 is being implemented via automatic adoption by the creation of direct link to the official website of UN.
- Malaysia's list <u>is amended in real-time</u> according to the Lists of the designated individuals and entities established, maintained and updated pursuant to the United Nations Security Council Resolutions (UNSCRs) 1718 (2006) and 2231(2015) against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) and Islamic Republic of Iran (Iran) respectively.



Compounding Penalty Regulation

- Malaysia is at the stage of <u>finalising</u> the <u>compounding</u> <u>penalty regulations</u>.
- <u>Engagement</u> with stakeholders is <u>currently being</u> <u>undertaken</u>. <u>Public consultation</u> will be done via <u>Unified</u> <u>Public Consultation</u> (UPC) Portal.
- The <u>implementation</u> is <u>targeted</u> to take into effect by <u>1st</u> <u>quarter next year</u>.



Export of Strategic Item

- For <u>exports</u> to <u>Restricted End Users Country List</u> <u>Special</u> <u>Permit</u> is <u>required</u>. Applications will also be <u>heavily</u> <u>scrutinised</u> and <u>one-on-one consultation</u> will also be conducted.
- <u>NO permit</u> will be <u>issued</u> for <u>exports</u> of S<u>trategic Items</u> to <u>Prohibited End Users List</u> i.e <u>UN 1718 List</u> – DPRK.
- <u>Embargoed</u> and <u>no exception</u> for <u>transit</u> of Strategic Items to <u>DPRK</u>.



Targeted Financial Sanctions (TFS) Relating to Proliferation

- Issuance of <u>Directive of Implementation</u> TFS/PF on April 2018.
- <u>Engagement/outreach</u> to the relevant stakeholders (Bank Negara Malaysia, Securities Commission and Labuan Offshore Financial Services Authority) is <u>ongoing</u>.
- <u>Malaysia</u> was <u>upgraded</u> to <u>compliant status</u> from the former partially compliant status at the FATF Plenary Meeting that was held in France on October 2018.



Improvements of SOP

- <u>Enhancements</u> of current <u>SOP</u> for <u>licensing work process</u> and <u>creation of new SOP for enforcement, information/</u> <u>intelligence and investigation handling</u> to provide uniformity and consistency among the relevant agencies.
- Guidance for <u>screening process</u> and identifying <u>Red Flag</u> indicators are being <u>included in the SOP</u> as well as <u>list of</u> <u>websites for reference</u> during licensing process.



ICP Enhancement

- An ICP is a <u>prerequisite for Malaysian enterprises</u> that wish to <u>avail themselves of bulk and multiple-use permits</u> <u>under the STA</u>.
- The revised ICP will be introduced on <u>17 October 2019</u>.
- <u>New elements</u> included transaction screening, corrective action and ITT.



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
