Strategic Trade Management Act (STMA)

"An act preventing the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction by managing the trade in strategic goods, the provision of related services, and for other purposes"



Republic Act No. 10697

STMA's Declaration of Policy

Philippines aims to...

- Be a Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) free territory
- Fulfill international commitments and obligations (United Nations Security Council Resolution 1540)
- Maintain international peace and security
- Promote economic growth through effective strategic trade management



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National Security Council-Strategic Trade Management Committee

A permanent committee under the National Security Council (NSC) acting as the central authority on all matters of strategic trade management.

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Strategic Trade Management Office

A bureau created under the administrative supervision of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), serves as the lead government agency responsible for managing the trade of strategic goods and technologies to prevent the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction.



Organizational Structure



Partners with industries to promote awareness and compliance Handles technical and end-use/end-user risk assessments on issuing authorization

Enforces the STMA, conducts audits, determines violations



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What are strategic goods?

- Products that, for security reasons or due to international agreements, are considered to be of such military importance that their export is either prohibited altogether or subject to specific conditions.
- Goods that are listed in the National Strategic Goods List (NSGL) which require authorization from the Strategic Trade Management Office (STMO).



UPDATED ANNUALLY

CATCH-ALL CONTROLS

- Goods or services may be used for WMDs or their means of delivery.
- Country of destination is subject to an international sanction/ arms embargo and goods may be used for military end-use.
- Goods may be used as parts/ components of military items that have been exported without a license.
- Exporter knows or suspects that the unlisted goods may be used for any of the uses in a) and b).

Warning/ Orders for Corrective Action



Limitation/ revocation/ annulment of authorization/ registration



Fines



Cancellation/ suspension of authority to operate with SEC/ DTI



Imprisonment for a period of *six* (6) months and one (1) day to *six* (6) years, and a fine from one hundred thousand pesos (P100,000.00) to one million pesos (P1,000,000.00)

CRIMINAL PENALTIES



Imprisonment for a period of *six* (6) years and one (1) day to twelve (12) years, and a fine from one million pesos (P1,000,000.00) to five million pesos (P5,000,000.00)



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Long-Term Vision

- I. Ensure the Effective Implementation of the STMA
- II. National Implementation of the UN Sanctions and the imposition of unilateral sanctions
- III. Harmonize the national implementation of all nonproliferation of WMD treaties (Chemical Weapons Convention, Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty, Biological Weapons Convention, et al.) under the STMA umbrella.
- IV. Promote the Philippines as a safe manufacturing, processing, and transit hub for strategic goods and technologies
